	1	Multiple choice cloze	The main focus is on vocabulary, e.g. idioms, collocations, fixed phrases, complementation, phrasal verbs, semantic precision.	8	
	2	Open cloze	The main focus is on awareness and control of grammar with some focus on vocabulary.	8	
	3	Multiple-choice cloze	The main focus is on vocabulary, in particular the use of affixation, internal changes and compounding in word formation.	8	
	4	Key word transformation	Grammar, vocabulary, collocation.	6

	5	Multiple choice	Detail, opinion, attitude, tone, purpose, main idea, gist, meaning from context, implication, text organisation features (exemplification, reference).	6	
	6	Gapped text	Cohesion, coherence, text structure.	6	
	7	Multiple matching	Detail, opinion, specific information, implication.	10	
Writing 1 hr 20 mins.	1	Compulsory task: Essay 140-190 words	Writing an essay giving opinion and providing reasons for the opinion.	1	
	2	One task to be selected from a choice of three. 140-190 words	Questions 2-4. Writing one from a number of possible text types based on a contextualised writing task: article, email/letter, report or review	1	
Listening 40 mins.	1	Multiple choice	The focus is on genre, identifying speaker feeling, attitude, topic, opinion, purpose, agreement between speakers, gist and detail.	8	
	2	Sentence completion	The focus is on detail, identifying specific information and stated opinion.	10	
	3	Multiple matching	The focus is on identifying attitude, opinion, gist, purpose, feeling, main points and details.	5	
	4	Multiple choice	The focus is on identifying opinion, attitude, detail, gist, main idea and specific information.	7	
Speaking 14 mins.	1	A conversation between the interlocutor and each candidate (spoken questions).		2 minutes	
	2	An individual, 'long turn' (1 minute) by each candidate with a response from the second candidate (30 seconds). In turn, the candidates are given a pair of photographs to talk about.		4 minutes	
	3	A two-way conversation between the candidates. The candidates are given spoken instructions with written stimuli with are used in discussion and decision-making tasks.		4 minutes	
	4	A discussion on topics related to the Part 3 collaborative task.		4 minutes
